Stay Safe at the Seaside

Before you start having fun, choose a meeting place in case you get lost.

If you go exploring, tell an adult where you are going and take a mobile phone if you have one.

At the Beach

Try to go to a beach with lifeguards.
Be careful of deep holes in the sand – they can fall in and trap you.

Look at the Flags

Swim only between the **red and yellow flags**.

A **red flag** means it is not safe to go in the sea.

Black and white flags are for surfers – don't swim there.

An **orange windsock** means it is very windy – don't use blow up toys.

In the Water

Swim with a friend and stay close to the shore.

If you get pulled by the water, don't panic. Put your hand up and shout for help. Try to swim sideways until you can reach the beach.

Blow up Toys

The wind can blow blow up toys out to sea very fast. It's best not to use them. Never use them when the orange windsock is flying.
